Chair's Report

Assembly Report from the Central California Regional (CCR) Chair

July 2023

Hello from the Regional Chair,

Narateen

Thanks to the hard work from the Narateen committee, our region is getting closer and closer to the day when we will have a Narateen meeting in Central California. The process takes time, however, because there are many laws and regulations designed to protect children and teens and we must carefully follow all of those rules. Recently another Nar-Anon region encountered issues with their Narateen groups. We can learn from their experience and take steps now to protect our Narateen groups. That region had to close their Narateen meetings. We do not want our Narateen meetings to run into the same issues. Therefore, Sunny has prepared a report on what happened in that other region, and I have created proposed amendments for our Narateen guidelines and training materials.

Consensus Based Decision Making

Within the Regional Service Committee (RSC), we are continuing to use Consensus Based Decision Making (CBDM) and shifting away from parliamentary procedures. At the July 2023 Regional Assembly, we should be able to use CBDM for all of our decisions. However, we will probably stay with parliamentary procedures regarding the budget. Basically, that means that after discussion we will ask for a Motion to adopt proposed budget changes for 2023, and then ask for a Motion to adopt the proposed budget for 2024. Motions will be helpful if there are any questions about whether or not we formally approved those budgets.

Financial Situation

There have been a few updates from the World Service Budget & Finance Committee since we met in January 2023. The World Service Office (WSO) is continuing to spend more money than they have coming in, although there are many extenuating circumstances. Some of the expenses are one-time expenses. Some of the reduction in income might be temporary. At this time, the WSO and the World Service Board are both asking groups and regions to increase the amount they are giving to WSO with the expectation that increasing giving will allow WSO to avoid drastic changes.

Interim World Service Conference (IWSC)

There will be an Interim World Service Conference in April, 2024. This IWSC will be more interactive with a focus on discussion rather than voting. The proposed cost will be much lower than the WSC in 2023 because the focus will be on discussion and not on voting. That means the IWSC will not pay for the Facilitator, Parliamentarian, and Secretaries to travel. Instead of charging \$1,950 per Delegate like in 2018, or \$500 per Delegate like in 2023, the cost for 2024 will be \$56 per Region. Not per Delegate, but per Region. This is a one-time experiment. The WSC in 2025 will probably go back to \$500 or maybe a bit more.

Screen Sharing

Selective screen sharing of Nar-Anon Conference Approved Literature (CAL) during a Nar-Anon meeting is now permitted. I sent out a report in June regarding Motion 43 for a specific list of shareable items. I shared a report in July regarding purchased copies of electronic literature (eBooks). In August and September I will send out two additional reports on other results from the World Service Conference (WSC) 2023.

The following year will be the World Service Conference 2025, Serve Without Borders. Worldwide motions will be submitted and the Conference Agenda Report (CAR) will be reviewed by the groups.

Members have conducted outreach in the following ways:

- Participated in the Recovery Center's family panel (Monterey) and Sun Street Centers (Salinas).

Narateen Subcommittee

Narateen Subcommittee Report, July, 2023

After the Regional Assembly approved the Narateen Safety Guidelines and Handbook at our July Regional Assembly, we submitted them for approval to the World Service Narateen Committee. They were reviewed and returned with notes for two minor corrections, which were made, and in September, the Guidelines were approved. Since then, the CCR Narateen subcommittee has been working with the Southern California Narateen subcommittee and the WS Narateen Committee to work towards establishing Narateen in our region.

In September we participated in an informational workshop presented by SoCal Narateen to answer questions for Nar-Anon members interested in becoming Narateen facilitators. The CCR Narateen subcommittee has improved our Narateen page on the Central California Nar-Anon website, added an auto reply to our Narateen email, and personalized the Narateen outreach flier.

Seeing a need for more communication, Committee member started an informal WhatsApp group chat for those members in service in Narateen and it's been well received by other facilitators around the world. Sunny and Alijah participate on the World Service Narateen Committee.

Recently there have been two new Narateen items posted on the WS website for fellowship review: a Narateen Safety Handbook and a Facilitator Training Slideshow. These are available to download and we encourage all groups to do so.

The Narateen subcommittee asked the RSC to consider whether we could apply for DOJ livescan services using the Region's EIN tax number, so we could establish our own process for fingerprinting and approving facilitators in Central CA. We had asked and been told by the world service that we were not allowed to use the World Service EIN. It turned out that CCR does use the World Service EIN, and its non-profit status, for our bank account. Perhaps in the future CCR may consider getting our own nonprofit status, but for now, CCR Narateen does not have permission to use that number. For that reason, we needed to get our own EIN for Narateen. Member applied for and received that number for us and we are now in the process of applying for the DOJ fingerprinting account, which may take some time.

Committee member found a way to be fingerprinted without a DOJ account and has had success. There is a form that a facilitator can fill out and write in the section titled Designee this is where they can write the NTPP person's name and address and the results will be sent to the NTPP person marked Confidential. In addition, member found that if a Facilitator is receiving government assistance, they can be fingerprinted for \$25.00; if they do not have any low-income services the fingerprint background check will cost them up to \$95.00.

Committee member also created Narateen Blue Book PowerPoint/PDF Slides that Facilitators can use during the meeting (not yet presented or approved by the committee)

Committee has approved the Facilitator Training Slide Presentation for Central California Region.

Committee is requesting zoom funds and Facilitator live scan funds.

Committee is working on Zoom Guidelines for minors since none have been created for zoom.

HISTORY: This meeting was officially started July 11, 2017. SOS existed prior but we have no written history before 2017. Our last in-person meetings were held until March, 2020 at the Sutter Maternity & Surgery Center in Santa Cruz. We shifted to the Zoom online format and have chosen to remain on-line with an audit of our SOS members every few months.

GOVERNANCE: We have a GSR (Sue R), alternate GSR (Carole S), and a Treasurer (Karen A). A group of 4 members rotate the role of facilitator each week. We do maintain an SOS email and it is monitored regularly. A short monthly business meeting is held the first Sunday of the month following the meeting.

ATTENDANCE: Our meeting attendance ranges between 10 to 14 each week. This has been an improvement since we adopted the Zoom online program. We do have newcomers regularly and some have come from outside the Monterey Bay area.

WEEKLY EMAIL: An email is sent out each Sunday as a reminder of the evening's meeting. To be placed upon our email list, we ask each week if anyone wants to place their email in the Zoom chat and then it is then added. To request deletion from the email list, the person can request that by return email. Each email contains information on how to attend our meeting along with links to CCR and WSO.

CAL: We do keep a supply of CAL literature locally that can be picked up from a member's home by appointment. Otherwise, there is a link to WSO for purchase of CAL directly.

DONATIONS: The Seventh Tradition is an announcement at the end of each meeting with an option to send a donation check to our Treasurer or to donate directly to CCR or WSO directly. We maintain a prudent balance of \$100 and generally donation an equal amount to CCR and WSO quarterly based on a group decision. We continue to explore an electronic donation system.

Thursday Sweet Serenity (BACK IN PERSON since July 15, 2021)

Group Report #131-030 Salinas FOR: July 22, 2023

History: The group began meeting in April 2011. With the pandemic in March 2020, our Salinas Sweet Serenity group was <u>suspended</u>. Half our group opted to go to the Salinas Monday Night Serenity virtual meetings while the other half wanted to meet back in person once the pandemic sanctions were lifted. So our FIRST in-person meeting was held again on July 15, 2021 at 6:30pm at our new location (Active Seniors Center - ASC at 100 Harvest Street in Salinas). We are no longer required to have had vaccinations at our new location (or wear masks).

Attendance: Before our meetings were suspended due to the pandemic, meeting attendance was stable with an average of 8 people. We have been fairly consistent with having 4 regulars at our weekly meetings now. At this time, meeting again in person now, we do have a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a GSR as well. We have had a few newcomers here and there but they usually have not kept coming back.

Format: A step is read and discussed during the fourth Thursday (using the yellow step booklet) and the daily reading from the SESH book other weeks. Another piece of conference approved literature (CAL) is selected when there is a fifth Thursday.

Treasurer's Report: The group's balance is \$138, not including the prudent reserve (\$150) and GSR funds (\$50). Recent Donations have been sent to WSO (\$100) and CCR (\$50) in May 2023. Monthly rent is \$50.

Successes, Challenges and Positive/Negative Impacts of the pandemic:

- We are not getting new members the way we were before the pandemic hit and we are still a smaller group now since we began meeting again in person in July 2021.
- Some previous members who attended regularly in person (before the pandemic began) still have not returned.
- + Our ASC (Active Senior Center) location is working out ok, but it may not be as welcoming for younger newcomers.
- + Those of us who attend do appreciate being able to meet in person again.
- + We are looking for ways to grow our meeting. We have posted a flier about our meetings at our venue location (Active Seniors Center ASC). We are patient.

Meeting History: The Friday Noon Group began meeting in the summer of 2010. There is no record of the exact date of the first meeting. At a business meeting in December, 2015, our group decided on a name: Bridge to Serenity.

Attendance: Our group ranges in size from 8–18 people, with at least 10 who currently attend consistently.

Newcomers: Newcomers appear regularly. We meet in a location that conducts seventeen 12-step programs each week; consequently, many of our newcomers are also members of these other programs.

Treasurer: Treasurer's report for the last quarter of 2022 included the following:

Literature \$157.00Donations: \$120 to WSO

• GSR Reserve: \$.00 (donated to WSO)

• Prudent Reserve: \$ 60.00

Account Balance: \$ 293.00 (estimate)

Rent is paid through June, 2023 (\$35.00 per month)

Format: All meetings are literature driven. A calendar is maintained with voluntary signups for the weekly Leader position. While it is not mandatory, a suggested literature rotation follows this guideline:

- Week #1 Tradition of the Month
- Week #2 Step of the Month
- Week #3 Choice of Conference approved literature (CAL)
- Week #4 Reading from SESH
- Week #5 Guest Speaker Meeting

Group Decisions:

Speaker's Meeting: At a recent business meeting, it was agreed that Speaker Meetings would be held on the odd months of the year (January, March, May, July September and November) rather than only those months that had 5 weeks. It was also agreed that the specific week of the month will be optional, depending on when a speaker is available.

Job Position Rotation Schedule: After a review of the pros and cons, it was agreed through group conscience that no formal time limit will be set for each position. An annual review will be held at the beginning of the year to give current officers an opportunity to resign and other members an opportunity to volunteer for the vacant positions.

Conference-approved Literature: A question was raised about whether or not each Nar-Anon group had the option of using only "Conference-approved" literature during a meeting. It was decided by group conscience that as long as the literature was based on 12-step material, it would be appropriate to share in the meeting.

Simi Valley SERENITY Group Report 131-08 Simi Valley FOR: July 22, 2023

History: The group began sometime in 2003 in one of the meeting rooms of Simi Valley United Methodist Church in the corner of Erringer Rd and Cochran. So, we will be celebrating our 20th year sometime this year! It has grown through the years with seamless transition between leaders: GSR and Service Positions. The church required group insurance when we returned to the in-person meeting on June 3, 2023.

Attendance: Prior to pandemic, the group attendance fluctuated between 10 to 30 participants. The group went virtual from March 21, 2020, to May 27, 2023. Zoom meeting attendance fluctuated from 4 to 25, but more recently averaged 6 to 8. Zoom meetings attracted members from Maryland, New Jersey, New York, and Florida. We returned to in-person meetings in June 2023, and we have 8 to 10 people in attendance, with 2 newcomers.

Format: We have sign-ups for weekly leaders and snacks. We start with readings from the blue book, 5-minute break for snacks and coffee, then leader shares and read from SESH book, after which we have group shares. To balance sharing, we limit shares to 3 to 5 minutes. Step Study is held on the last Saturday of every month an hour before the regular meeting. Prior to this year, Step Study was held every week an hour before the meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Group has a balance of about \$80 as of July 1, 2023. The monthly rent is \$25. The group donates to WSO and Central Region when able. Members are encouraged to donate to WSO and Central Region online.

Successes, Challenges and Positive/Negative Impacts of the pandemic:

- It was easier to invite speakers for zoom meetings, and we had as many as 45 in attendance during one of these meetings.
- We have regular members pre-pandemic that were not able to join our zoom meetings due to various reasons. We are still waiting for some of them to come back to meetings in-person.
- We gained regular members from other regions of CA and other states that we had to let go because of in-person meetings. We also lost regular members who prefer zoom meetings.
- We are looking for ways to grow our meeting, and to have outreach events in the future.
