It has grown through the years with seamless transition between leaders: GSR and Service Positions. The church required group insurance when we returned to the in-person meeting on June 3, 2023.

Attendance: Prior to pandemic, the group attendance fluctuated between 10 to 30 participants. The group went virtual from March 21, 2020, to May 27, 2023. Zoom meeting attendance fluctuated from 4 to 25, but more recently averaged 6 to 8. Zoom meetings attracted members from Maryland, New Jersey, New York, and Florida. We returned to in-person meetings in June 2023, and we have 8 to 10 people in attendance, with newcomers coming and going.

Format: We have sign-ups for weekly leaders and snacks. We start with readings from the blue book, 5-minute break for snacks and coffee, then leader shares and read from SESH book, after which we have group shares. To balance sharing, we limit shares to 3 to 5 minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Group has a balance of about \$50 as of January 13, 2024. The monthly rent is \$25. The group donates to WSO and Central Region when able. Members are encouraged to donate to WSO and Central Region online.

Successes, Challenges and Positive/Negative Impacts of the pandemic:

- It was easier to invite speakers for zoom meetings, and we had as many as 45 in attendance during one of these meetings.
- We have regular members pre-pandemic that were not able to join our zoom meetings due to various reasons. We are still waiting for some of them to come back to meetings in-person.
- We gained regular members from other regions of CA and other states that we had to let go because of in-person meetings. We also lost regular members who prefer zoom meetings.
- We are looking for ways to grow our meeting, and to have outreach events in the future.

FOR: January 20, 2024

History: The group began meeting in April 2011. With the pandemic in March 2020, our Salinas Sweet Serenity group was <u>suspended</u>. Half our group opted to go to the Salinas Monday Night Serenity virtual meetings while the other half wanted to meet back in person once the pandemic sanctions were lifted. Our FIRST in-person meeting was held again on July 15, 2021, at our new location (Active Seniors Inc.—ASI at 100 Harvest Street in Salinas).

Attendance: Before our meetings were suspended due to the pandemic, meeting attendance was stable with an average of 8 people. We currently have 4 regularly attending members and 2 others who are new and come when they can.

Format: A step is read and discussed during the fourth Thursday (using the yellow step booklet) and the daily reading from the SESH book other weeks. Another piece of conference approved literature (CAL) is selected when there is a fifth Thursday. We have recently changed our meeting time to 6:00-7:00 pm.

Treasurer's Report: As of January 1, 2024, the balance forward is \$104 not including the prudent reserve (\$150) and GSR funds (\$50). Recent Donations have been sent to WSO (\$75) and CCR (\$50) in November and December 2023 respectively. Monthly rent is \$50.

Successes, Challenges, and a Sad Passing:

- We are not getting new members the way we were before the pandemic hit and we are still a smaller group now since we began meeting again in person in July 2021.
- + Our ASI (Active Senior Inc.) location is working out well; however, the center requires that all outside groups must include a member of ASI. Our group secretary is an ASI member and knows the necessary codes to unlock/lock the building. In the event that she is unable to attend, an ASI officer is sometimes available to let us in and lock up. During periods when the facility is closed, we do not meet.
- ++ Our members are active in service: two members participate in outreach panels at Sun Street Men's Residential Center to share experience, strength, and hope with the residents and any family members who may be in attendance. Another member is active in the CCR's Outreach Committee. A service rotation for GSR and Treasurer took place in September 2023. Our Secretary kept her position.
- —We are grieving the loss of Kim K., who passed away suddenly in November after a brief illness. Kim served enthusiastically as GSR for Sweet Serenity from February 2020—with a two-year+ suspension until in-person meetings resumed July 2021—until September 2023. We miss Kim's sparkle, her commitment to service, and the joy she spread to all who were fortunate to be touched by her life.
